he Laudato Si' Circle meets on the first Thursday of each month and our next meeting will be on 7th December at 7:30pm in the church portable. Please come and join us in prayer, study and action, in solidarity with the rest of the Laudato Si' Movement across the world.

Our latest campaign is about the transition from fossil fuels to clean energy, as the burning of fossil fuels continues to exacerbate climate change, an already serious humanitarian problem that results in the deaths of millions of people each year through drought, famine, heat-stroke and extreme weather events.

In Laudate Deum (para 55) Pope Francis writes "The necessary transition towards clean energy sources such as wind and solar energy, and the abandonment of fossil fuels is not progressing at the necessary speed." In order to accelerate that transition we are involved in a legal campaign to get oil companies to pay their fair share of climate costs. Use of the legal system has been proven to be very effective across the world in helping to recover the costs from oil companies, whose products have contributed so much to causing climate change.
