Welcome Fr. Thomas Arackal, IMS!!

Effective July 9, 2015, Fr. Arackal will be the Pastor/Parish Priest at St. Joseph's, Port Moody. Let's take this opportunity welcome him. Fr. Arackal is no stranger because he was the assistant priest/Vicar at All Saints' Parish for the last 2 years. He has helped in many occasions with our confession for the PREP program and our penitential services. He has said a few weekday Masses at St. Joseph's. He is definitely not new to the territory.

Also, Fr. Arackal is not new to being a Pastor. He has served two years as an assistant and 11 years as a Pastor in the Diocese of Little Rock, Arkansas. He has experience in building a parish hall there. His expertise in building is even more impressive back in India where he came from. While he was the Procurator General, i.e., the Financial Administrator of his religious congregation, Fr. Arackal built the Theological Seminary in Varansi, India. For 2 years, he has laboured to make an immense building for the training of seminarians for his religious congregation. He also taught English as a seminary professor there, too.

Like diocesan priests who take the vow of chastity and obedience, Fr. Arackal, being a religious, also takes a vow of poverty. He belongs to the Religious Congregation of Indian Mission Society (founded 1941) whose main purpose is to spread the gospels, especially, to very difficult and challenging area where Catholic is a very, very small minority. These pioneer missionaries to non-Christian area deserve our upmost respect for their sacrifice and dedication to bring the Holy Gospels to the ends of the world, as commanded by our Lord Jesus Christ. Besides looking after some parish in the United States, IMS also has houses in Germany, Alberta and Nova Scotia, Canada.

Let's open our hearts to Fr. Arackal to St. Joseph with resounding joy!!

The Power of Pentecost

"All were filled with the Holy Spirit..." - Acts 2:4

How were the apostles changed at Pentecost?

God sent signs of the Holy Spirit. Strong wind - a sign for the ears. Tongues of fire - a sign for the eyes. Mary and the apostles were filled with The Spirit, the divine life of the Trinity - they felt loved by God, filled with courage

How did Pentecost fulfill the promise of Jesus?

The first Pentecost - The Jewish Pentecost - commemorated God's Covenant at Mt. Sinai when the finger of God wrote the law in stone. The Christian Pentecost - fulfilled what happened at Mt. Sinai - when the finger of God wrote the law in the hearts of his people. The Holy Spirit is the new law and principle of the New Covenant.

What is the importance of Pentecost for us? - Acts 2:22-36. Peter's proclamation - Jesus of Nazareth is the power of the Spirit, you and I killed him through sin, God raised him from the dead, he is Lord. Our response - Decide to proclaim Jesus as Lord, let his lordship be life-changing, proclaim him Lord throughout our bodies, ask the Father for a New Pentecost.
