

November - The Month of Holy Souls in Purgatory



Catholic piety has assigned entire months of the year to various devotions. As a reminder of our duty to pray for the suffering faithful in Purgatory, the Church has dedicated the month of November to the Holy Souls. The Holy Souls are those who have died in the state of grace but who are not yet free from all punishment due to their unforgiven venial sins and all other sins already forgiven for which satisfaction is still to be made. They are certain of entering Heaven, but first they must be purified in Purgatory. The Holy Souls cannot help themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege of brotherhood that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and, especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

ROMAN CATHOLIC CHALLENGE

One more member on the team is needed to compete. Please join the practice November 7th, at 10 am in the upstairs room at St. Josephs if you are in level 5-6 PREP, and interested in an exciting challenge.



The Roman Catholic Challenge team meets on Saturdays at 10 am in the upstairs room with the big challenge coming up on November 21. There is also an opportunity for the children to compete in Oregon.

If anyone knows of a child in level 5 or 6 PREP who can join the team, one more member on the team is needed to compete.

RC challenge is like a "Reach for the Top" type competition put on through the Catholic Schools in BC and the US with live buzzers, strict competition guidelines, and multiple adjudicators. The program follows a Jeopardy game show kind of format - where the answer comes in the form of a question. The children are responsible to learn literally more than 1000 specific catechism based questions. Last year St. Josephs had the very first team from a parish, all of the other teams were from the Catholic Schools. The children on our St. Joseph's team struggled at first, but lost their last match by only 5 points..... Annette Montagliani and Amanda Cabralda have been practising for the New Year, ready to go again. However, the team requires a minimum of 3 children to register by Nov.14th. If we do not have a third member, we cannot register.

Mr. Lee, our grade 7 PREP teacher, has prepared teams for the RC Challenge for many years and has 2 other teams from Traditional Learning Academy registered. Some sample questions for your enjoyment:

Q: This consists of words and actions by which a thing or person is placed under the care of God. A: What is a blessing?
