

## From Rejection to Acceptance

Zacchaeus was a mean-spirited little man (little in every way), who was rejected by his fellow citizens. Yet, hated and shunned by others, Jesus reached out to him with acceptance. Indeed, Jesus invited himself to Zacchaeus' home for a visit. That shocked the crowd observing the event. But Jesus knew what He was doing. His acceptance of the despised tax collector moved Zacchaeus to change his life and lifestyle. He returned what he had cheated others out of fourfold and gave half of his wealth to the poor. Amazing! Zacchaeus' story is a reminder that looking to and following Christ can get our lives in proper balance especially in relationship to God and others.



## November - The Month of Holy Souls in Purgatory



Catholic piety has assigned entire months of the year to various devotions. As a reminder of our duty to pray for the suffering faithful in Purgatory, the Church has dedicated the month of November to the Holy Souls. The Holy Souls are those

who have died in the state of grace but who are not yet free from all punishment due to their unforgiven venial sins and all other sins already forgiven for which satisfaction is still to be made. They are certain of entering Heaven, but first they must be purified in Purgatory. The Holy Souls cannot help themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege of brotherhood that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and, especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Envelopes are available at the table by the church entrance. Write names of intentions on envelope, include donation, and place in the collection. The envelopes will be kept on the altar during the month of November.


## MASS FOR THE DECEASED
