

It is our great privilege of brotherhood that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.


Envelopes are available at the table by the church entrance. Write names of intentions on envelope, include donation, and place in the collection. The envelopes will be kept on the altar during the month of November.
